Orientation Checklist

Student Orientation Thursday, August 11

Freshmen: 9:00-11:00 a.m.

Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors: 1:00-3:00 p.m.

CHS PTSA is pleased to host orientation for the 2011-2012 school year.
To make the most of this event, please follow the checklist below:

General notes:

- Bring a checkbook.** Multiple checks will be required! Separate checks will need to be written to CHS and to CHS PTSA, Booster Club, FFA, etc.
- Find your student's name on the **lists** posted on the wall outside the media center. Your child's advisement teacher/room will be indicated. Please go to this advisement teacher's room to secure a locker and agenda, submit your completed Affidavit of Residency form (or form voucher) in exchange for a course verification form, and complete important contact information forms.
- Bus Information.** Available on-line: <http://edulogweb.fultonschools.org/edulog/webquery/>

In the advisement teacher's room:

- Pay locker/agenda fee. (\$25).** Lockers will be assigned by each student's advisement teacher who will also distribute agendas.
- Turn in completed Affidavit of Residency form or form voucher in exchange for a course verification form.** Affidavits that need to be notarized must be brought to the media center. And, all freshmen and new students must bring their Affidavits to the media center for processing. Students whose Affidavits are processed in the media center will receive a voucher they can give to their advisement teacher in exchange for their course verification form.
- Complete other important **forms** here.

In the media center:

- Work with Affidavit of Residence** form specialists. Notary Publics will be available here to help complete Affidavit of Residence forms. Check the PTSA website (www.centptsa.org) to get a hard copy of the appropriate form and instructions.

In the hallways:

- Join CHS PTSA**—tables will be located near the front and gym door entrances. Membership forms were sent in the summer newsletter and are available on the PTSA website: www.centptsa.org. Membership forms include volunteer opportunities. Directory Sponsorship forms can also be turned in at the PTSA tables; and, Publix Scan Cards will also be available.
- Join the Centennial Knights Booster Club.** A table will be set up in front of the gym. Read about this organization in the summer newsletter or on-line: www.centennialknights.com.
- Visit with counselors**—if you have questions about course offerings and CHS academic programs (Room J-109).
- Shop at the School Store**—located in the concession stand in front of the gym.

In the cafeteria:

- Visit CHS clubs and activities** many of which will have tables. Please visit these groups and get information about these organizations. Applications, etc. will be available.
- Join FFA (Foundation for the Fine Arts).** Read about this organization in the summer newsletter or on-line: www.chsffa.org.
- Pick up information about the **MealpayPlus system** used to manage a student's meal account on-line (www.mealpayplus.com) and purchase meal cards. (Fixed meal costs: breakfast, **\$1.20**; lunch, **\$2.35**. Reduced meal costs: breakfast, 30¢; lunch, 40¢; eligible students only. Ala carte selections also available.)

Location TBA:

- Pick up **temporary parking information**— *Seniors (1-3 p.m.) only!*

Administrators will be available throughout the building to answer general questions.

A Letter From Our Principal

Welcome to a new year at Centennial High School!

Whether this is your first year or you are returning for another, I hope you know parents are encouraged to become involved in high school. PTSA and the school are always in need of volunteers, and your child is always in need of knowing you are part of his/her life! During Orientation in August (**August 11**) you can sign up to help in various ways.

Let me take a moment to make sure that I suggest a few things:

1. Help your child get involved in school beyond classes. We have plenty of service clubs, athletic programs, and other organizations that would help your child feel a part of Centennial.
2. Help your child plan for the future . . . use GACollege411.
3. Make sure that you look at the right courses. Advanced Placement (AP) is necessary for many programs of study but not all post secondary options require students to be "AP warriors".
4. Electives become very important to your child . . . and we have many to offer.
5. Dress Code: Please note that hats and most headwear are not allowed at Centennial. Pants should be worn at the waist and underwear should not be showing from the shirt or the pants. Pants should not have holes above the knees and skirts and shorts should not be too short. (As a rule, they should be just around the knee.)
6. All students receive a locker . . . when the students arrive at school in the morning, their book bags are to be placed in that locker.
7. I encourage you to have your child read prior to the start of school and throughout the school year. Go to the website www.lexile.com for some suggestions on reading levels and book titles. A child's vocabulary development is greatly influenced by expanding their reading.



Junior Parent Night:

New Student Enrollment:

Students who moved into the Centennial cluster from another district, transferring from a private middle or high school, or who are re-enrolling after an absence need to enroll in Centennial High School. New enrollment will occur on the following dates:

Monday-Wednesday, August 1-3 and Tuesday-Wednesday, August 9-10

All registration sessions will take place in the CHS cafeteria:

Session 1: 9:00am (only) Session 2: 12:00pm (only)

To ensure that your enrollment proceeds smoothly, it is critical that you provide all of the required documents at the time of enrollment. To assure that you bring the proper documents go to the Centennial website at www.chsknights.com and click on Counseling.

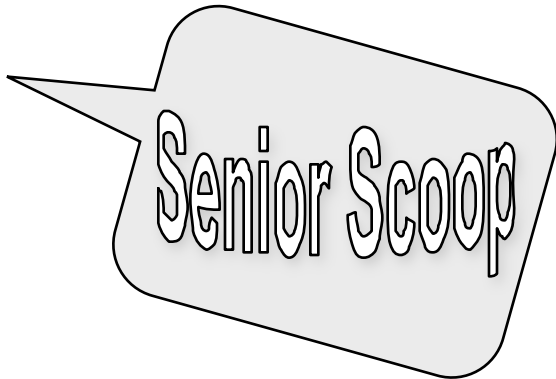
Joint/Dual Enrollment:

Students who have been accepted to participate in Dual Enrollment for the 2011-12 school year (Georgia Perimeter College, Ga. State, Kennesaw, Ga. Tech, etc.) should go online to apply for **ACCEL**.

This program pays for college courses while the student is still in high school. There are three parts of the process and the student must complete Part I. After completing Part I, email Mr. Cox in the Counseling Office and he will complete Part II. When that is done the college completes Part III and it is sent to Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC) for approval. Only CORE COURSES will be paid (English, Math, Social Studies, Science, World Language). Go to www.GACollege411 and look for ACCEL to register online.

All ACCEL courses are paid for with HOPE funds so are counted against HOPE college credits.

 - ✓ Current utility bill (gas, electric, or water)
 - ✓ Current paycheck stub
 - ✓ Apartment lease showing name of lessee
 - ✓ Receipt to have utilities connected
 - ✓ Homeowner's/renter's insurance registration card
- You will need to complete a form for each of your CHS students!

Forms will be collected during Orientation, *Thursday, August 11*. **If you don't have time to get your form notarized, the CHS wrestling team will provide Notary Public services in the Media Center; a suggested donation of \$4 will be requested.**

Ga/Georgia Tech Workshop at Centennial High School

The Admission Office at UGa and Georgia Tech will provide a joint workshop on the admissions standards and requirements at Centennial High School on Sunday, August 14, 2011 from 2:00pm-4:00pm in the Auditorium. This is a great opportunity to get questions answered and additional information you would not get in other sessions.

College Probe:

Representatives of 80-100 colleges will be available and will have information at North Point Mall on September 13, 2011 from 6:00pm-9:00pm. This event is free and students, parents or guardians can attend. There will be other fairs in the area this year and CHS also hosts many college visits. Please visit the CHS counseling website to view a college visit schedule.

Visitations:

Students may take up to three excused college visitation days during his/her senior year. For the student to receive an excused absence three steps must be taken:

1. Student brings in a request from the parent/guardian stating the date of the visit and location. This note must be taken to Mrs. White in the Counseling Office **at least three days prior to the absence**.
2. Students are then given a form which all of his/her teachers must complete.
3. The student is given a form for the college to complete to verify the visit.

Assignments missed during college visitation days should be turned into the teachers prior to the absence unless other arrangements have been made. College visitation days will not be granted during final exams and are not counted against parking privileges. **Requests for absences less than three days prior to the college visitation will not be granted and will be considered unexcused absences.**

College Applications:

Here is the procedure for having college applications sent from Centennial High School in 2011-12:
Seniors will send their own applications instead of through the Counseling Office.

With every application a student sends to a college, a transcript is needed by the college to complete the admission file (see below). Students should send the college application online (or by mail) anytime they are ready. Generally, most students should send them in before Thanksgiving but the sooner the better. Some colleges have different application procedures and deadlines so check with the college directly for accurate information. In addition, if a student is applying for a scholarship from the college, there are specific deadlines for an application and additional information to complete.

The Counseling Office highly recommends sending in the college application **ON-LINE**. It will save time, paper and processing time (by the college). Make sure the whole application is completed. You must have a transcript sent from the counseling office. Most college applications should be available **on-line** in late August. Paper applications will be available usually in September – call the college to receive one directly or attend a local College Night.

Students will need to complete a "Transcript Request Form".

Transcript will include grades through the 11th grade. No SAT/ACT/AP scores are reported on the transcript.

You must have those sent separately. Also, your HOPE GPA is not included on the transcript.

Transcripts to public colleges/universities in Georgia will be sent online through GACollege411.

Also, if you complete the *Common Application*, transcripts (and counselor recommendations) can be sent online.

Transcripts to private colleges, even those in Georgia, will most likely have to be sent through the mail.

All transcripts must be official and be sent from the Counseling Office whether online or in the mail.

The student must complete a **Transcript Request Form** (available in Counseling Office) to have a transcript sent.

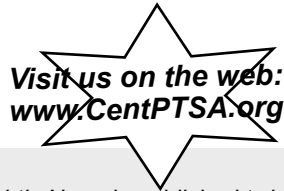
Each transcript will cost \$3 to send. These are the options for mailing a transcript:

The Counseling Office provides envelope and stamps at an extra cost of \$2 or the student provides envelope and stamps.

The Counseling Office can send the transcript or put it into the sealed envelope and give it to the student to mail.
